

Extra Credit Suggestions for Spanish I Class

The following are only a few suggestions of things you can do for extra credit. The philosophy behind extra credit for Spanish class is that:

1. Extra credit is an “extra” to help the grade of a student who has been trying, turning in work, doing everything they need to, but needs an extra “something.” Therefore, you may not do extra credit if you have any assignments that are not handed in.
2. It must foster Spanish knowledge for you.
3. It must foster Spanish knowledge for the class OR benefit the teacher in some way.

All extra credit projects must be approved by the teacher to ensure maximum points will be earned, or to make sure that you can even do that project. Each project will be worth a maximum of 10 points (determined by quality, what it seems you learned, effort, etc.). You may do two projects per semester, however the project type may not be repeated for the remainder of the year. If a project is to be presented to the class, arrangements must be made in advance and it will be presented at the teacher’s convenience. You may use your imagination to come up with other ideas.

POSSIBILITES:

1. Present/display information that you received by writing to a foreign government, tourist agency, airline, chamber of commerce, etc. Present this information to the class.
2. Make and present a Spanish learning game.
3. Make a cultural presentation.
4. Make a bulletin board that is seasonal or thematic and explain it to the class.
5. Learn and teach a traditional Spanish/Hispanic song to the class.
6. Bring a resource person to class, present information about that person’s history, what they do, etc. Allow for some question & answer time.
